An Individual Strategy for Ordination

Work and learn where you live—with the exception of one year Field Education in a nearby congregation during candidacy.

Have an individual learning plan that evaluates competency and provides the COM with an understanding of your readiness for ordination.

Begin by checking out the Ordination Manual on norcalepiscopal.org. Talk to your priest. Talk to the Bishop.

With the bishop's permission, formation can start before postulancy. Spend 3 or 4 years in discernment. Then apply for ordination. This program does not guarantee ordination. You will, however, develop a heart for diakonia and servant ministry.
