



Hispanics are the fastest growing ethnic segment expected to grow 167 percent from 2010 to 2050, compared to 42 percent for the total population.



### Projected U.S. Population Growth From 2010 to 2050






Percent of Hispanic adults ages 25 and older...





## College Enrollment Rates among 18- to 24-Year-Old High School Completers, by Race and Ethnicity





## Mobile Device Use By Hispanics








